


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

Chris Wormald



Born in 1961, Chris Wormald is a conductor, pianist, horn player, arranger, adjudicator, teacher and composer from the North West of England. He has played the French Horn professionally for over 30 years in many UK orchestras, the highlight being with the Philharmonia at The Barbican in London, and he was a multiple award-winning secondary school teacher for 34 years in England, becoming Classic FM Music Teacher of The Year at a lavish ceremony in London in 2001. Chris has been a member of both the UK National Association of Brass Band Conductors and National Association of Brass Band Adjudicators for over three decades.

As a Tenor Horn player, Chris was a member of the National Youth Brass Band of Great Britain together with Nicholas Childs, Steven Mead and many leading figures of the brass band world today and played with the NYBBGB under Harry Mortimer at Belle Vue in 1978. Post university, Chris has conducted brass and wind bands, performed, toured and worked professionally all over the world.

Highlights include conducting Brighouse & Rastrick at Leek Arts Festival, conducting Grimethorpe in concerts from Reading Town Hall to South Wales, being Musical Director of Wingates following on from Howard Snell and guest conducting Black Dyke Band in both 2018 and 2019 performing his own arrangements. Chris has conducted wind bands professionally in North Carolina, USA and at the personal invitation of Jim Shepherd, he joined James Shepherd Versatile Brass as French Horn soloist for five years in 1990, the year he was also appointed to Smithills School as Director of Music. Chris quickly formed his internationally renowned Smithills School Senior Brass, Wind and Big bands and over the next twenty years of competition they won over sixty, major national and international competitions including becoming inaugural World Brass Band Champions in Kerkrade, Holland in 2005 (Adult, 3rd Section) and winning sixteen National Festival of Music For Youth titles at the Royal Festival Hall in London and Symphony Hall in Birmingham. Chris conducted his Smithills musicians all over the World on over twenty sell-out concert tours abroad, from Norway in the north to New Zealand in the south and Japan in the east to the five concert tours of America in the west in addition to eight times at the Royal Albert Hall in London before he retired from teaching in 2015 to work full time as a freelance conductor, horn player, pianist, adjudicator and arranger.

Chris has over one hundred national and international adjudications to his credit ranging from multiple Swiss, French and English National Championships to the Muse Wind Band Festival in Singapore. He also has over one hundred published brass and wind band arrangements worldwide with leading publishing companies, many of them recorded on CD by Black Dyke, Cory and Brighouse & Rastrick bands plus many more around the world. He is thrilled and delighted to be published by Editions Marc Reift.
