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# Charles Le Téméraire

## Jean Daetwyler

**Français:** Charles le Téméraire fut un grand monarque de la Renaissance (1432 - 1477). Il fut en lutte avec le Roi de France Louis XI. Les Suisses lui livrèrent les batailles de Grandson et de Morat en 1475, et il mourut à la bataille de Nancy en 1477. Ce poème symphonique décrit le caractère à la fois humain et guerrier de ce prince qui voulut construire un royaume entre la France et l'Allemagne. Le "Risoluto" évoque une armée qui s'avance vers le champ de bataille. On entend les premiers signaux des sentinelles. La bataille s'engage à partir de la lettre "I". Un grand crescendo doit conduire au fortissimo de la lettre "N", qui est le point culminant de ce passage central. Le thème des trombones de la lettre "O" doit être très expressif. Il exprime la désillusion de Charles le Téméraire après ses défaites. Le passage chromatique de la lettre "P" doit prendre une grande intensité dramatique : c'est la mort de Charles le Téméraire dans un étang glacé devant Nancy. À partir de la lettre "R", le poème symphonique reprend le thème du début, la lettre "T" est un rappel du destin tragique de "Charles le Téméraire", et les 10 dernières mesures reprennent le thème rythmique de cette composition. Le compositeur laisse une grande liberté d'interprétation aux directeurs. L'essentiel est d'exprimer les sentiments de ce prince dont la vie ne fut qu'une longue désillusion. Les différentes phases d'une bataille doivent être décrites par des changements de mouvement et des oppositions marquées de nuances. Les tempi métronomiques ne sont que des indications et non pas des obligations mathématiques. L'auteur de ce poème symphonique prie les directeurs de s'en tenir à l'essentiel et de ne pas se perdre dans les détails. La musicalité doit passer avant tout.

**Deutsch:** Karl der Kühne, Herzog von Burgund (1467-1477) war ein großer Monarch der Renaissance (1432-1477). Er plante die Gründung eines großen, selbständigen burgundischen Reiches, kämpfte gegen König Ludwig XI von Frankreich, gegen die mit Frankreich verbündeten Eidgenossen und Lothringer und wurde bei Grandson und Murten besiegt. Wenig später verlor er bei Nancy die Schlacht und sein Leben.

Diese symphonische Dichtung schildert den Charakter des Herzogs sowohl menschlich als auch kriegerisch. Seine Armee rückt langsam gegen das Schlachtfeld von Nancy vor. Der Angriff wird stürmischer "B" (Risoluto) und bereits erklingen die ersten verhaltenen Angriffssignale. Bei Buchstabe "I" wendet sich das Schlachtenglück zu Gunsten der Eidgenossen und in einem großen "Crescendo" bis zu "N" gelingt der Durchbruch. Die Flucht des Burgunderheeres ist nicht mehr aufzuhalten. Das ausdrucksstarke Thema der Posaunen ab Buchstabe "O" drückt die Enttäuschung über die Niederlage Karls des Kühnen aus. Die chromatischen Durchgänge ab "P" sollen durch ihre große dramatische Stärke ergreifen und den Tod Karls des Kühnen charakterisieren, der ihn auf der Flucht in einem eisbedeckten Teich bei Nancy ereilt. Ab dem Buchstaben "R" kehren wir wieder zum Anfangsthema zurück. Die Schlacht ist vorbei und bei "S" wird das tragische Ende des großen Burgunders verkündet. Die Überlebenden flüchten überstürzt (Allegro vivo), "T" und Trompeten sowie Posaunen verkünden den Abbruch des Kampfes.

Der Komponist überlässt dem Interpreten eine große Gestaltungsfreiheit. Hauptsache ist, das Gefühlsempfinden "Karl des Kühnen" nachzuvollziehen und in der Wiedergabe **so** auszudrücken, dass man seine Enttäuschung vom Leben mitempfindet. Die verschiedenen Phasen der Schlacht sollen bei den Veränderungen von Bewegungen fühlbar sein und in den Gegenüberstellungen feine Nuancen aufweisen. Die metronymischen Tempi sind nur Interpretationshilfen und keine mathematischen Verpflichtungen. Der Komponist dieser symphonischen Dichtung bittet die Dirigenten, sich auf das Wesentliche zu konzentrieren und sich nicht in Details zu verlieren. Die Komposition soll sinngemäß interpretiert werden.



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# Jean Daetwyler

## *English:*

Jean Daetwyler was born in Basle on 24 January 1907 but he soon move to Bulle. His father, a confectioner, settled in the canton of Fribourg where he found employment at the Broc chocolate factory.

Thus Jean Daetwyler did all his schooling in Bulle and graduated with a commercial diploma as so ardently desired by his father.

But working in an office did not appeal to Jean Daetwyler. He had already decided what he wanted to do – he would be a musician or a writer. A first composition, dated 1919, was found in his archives as well as unfinished tale written in 1921 "to amuse mummy".

Once he had completed his commercial studies, Jean Daetwyler therefore set out for Paris. Music had become his true reason for living. For nearly twelve years, from summer 1927 to the end of 1938, he studied at the Conservatory, the Schola Cantorum and the César Franck School. He followed classes in composition, harmony, counterpoint, Gregorian Chant and orchestral conducting.

His teachers included Vincent Indy, Guy de Lioncourt, Auguste Bertelin, Jean de Valois, Amédée Gastoué, Charles Koechlin and Paul Leflemme. In all the schools he attended, Jean Daetwyler picked up the first prizes.

In 1933, he married. The couple were to be blessed with three children, two of whom were born in Paris. In 1938, Jean Daetwyler settled in Sierre and was taken on by the "Gérondine". For more than 40 years, Jean Daetwyler was to mark the lay and religious vocal and instrumental musical life of his city and region.

He was in charge of the "Gérondine" for 40 years and "Sainte Cécile" for 39 years. In 1947, he founded the *Chanson du Rhône*, which he directed until 1991. Beside his composition and direction activities, Jean Daetwyler taught harmony and counterpoint at the Sion Conservatory of which he was the co-founder with Georges Haenni.

He also served as member of various musical commissions and as an expert at countless federal and cantonal music and singing festivals. And we cannot forget Jean Daetwyler, the journalist, as much concerned by the life of a worker as by functioning of a local municipal committee, as much as by the situation of the peasant as by the philosophical works of Teilhard de Chardin or as much by youth problems as by the political situation in the world.

But the composer has always taken precedence over the critic, the narrator or the poet. Indeed, it was as such that he was honoured by the Foundation Rünzi in 1973 and by the Canton of Valais in 1981. The 1981 prize confirmed the *Prix rhodanien* for music that he had received in 1946.

Jean Daetwyler was extraordinarily prolific. The Suisa catalogue of his works contains 673 titles, covering all types of music: symphonies, concerti, chamber music, ballets, choir and brass band music. One cannot forget the numerous religious compositions and festivals that linger in everyone's memory: *Fêtes du Rhône*, *Fête des Abricots*, *Seigle et Vignes* and *Barrage*, to mention but a few.

As the works of Jean Daetwyler were published, the number of his admirers increased. His concerti for Alpenhorn toured the world. The number of records he made increased constantly. Jean Daetwyler finally passed away in Sierre on 4 June 1994. But he is not dead. He is merely sleeping in the shadow of his rock.
